

Silver Linings Sew Along- Block 2

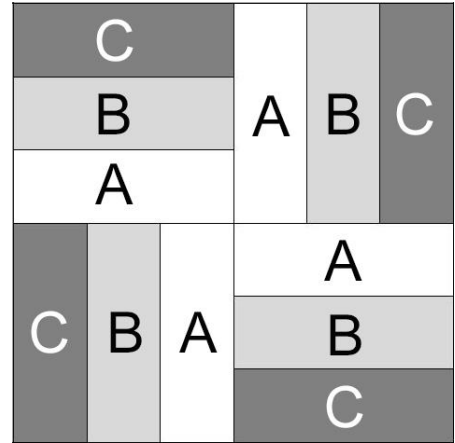
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Another classic block, traditionally called the Rail Fence block. This block is called “All Things are Possible,” because when I look at it, I can imagine those strips all starting at the center of the block, but then reaching out and going on into infinity... and it reminds me of the infinity of possibilities.

Completed block size = 6 1/2" (including seam allowance)

Seam allowance is 1/4"

You will need:

Fabric A- (1) 1 1/2" x 15" strip

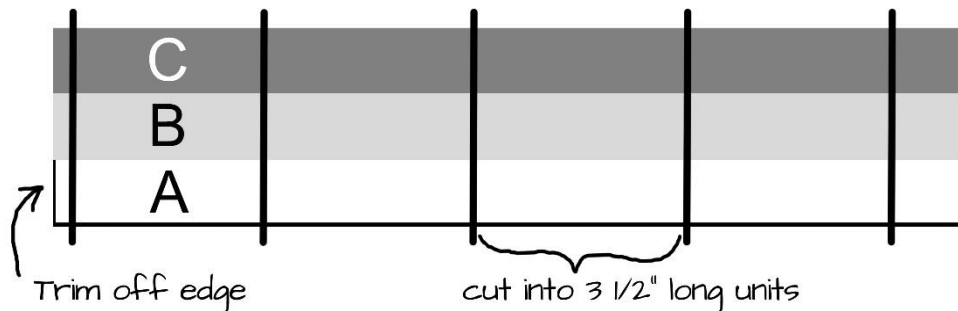
Fabric B- (1) 1 1/2" x 15" strip

Fabric C- (1) 1 1/2" x 15" strip

Sew the strips together as shown; press seam allowances toward center strip (fabric B.) The unit should measure 3 1/2" x 15".



Trim off the end of the strip so it's nice and neat. Cut the unit into (4) units, each unit should measure 3 1/2" square.



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Sew the units together into a block; press seam allowances as shown by arrows:
